Block 31: Dot Dash - Kansas Troubles Quilters, Lynne Hagmeier, Designer

Use (2) dark and (1) light fabrics. Fabrics are listed in order of use.

KT Layered Patchwork

A - (2) squares, 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" □ (DARK #1)

B - (4) squares, 3" x 3" (LIGHT)

C - (4) rectangles, 1 1/2" x 3" (LIGHT)

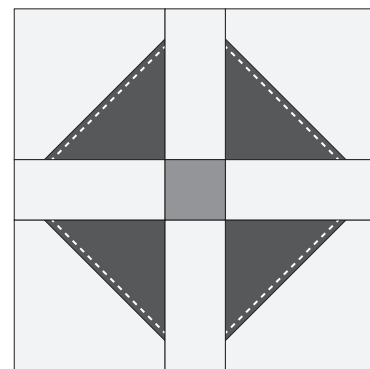
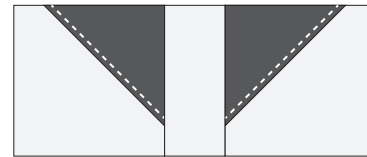
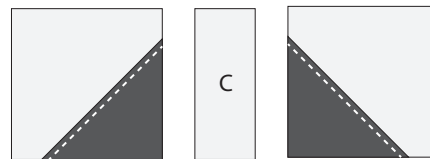
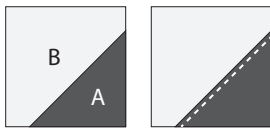
D - (1) square, 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" (DARK #2)

□ = cut once diagonally from corner to corner

2. Lay out A/B units, C rectangles, and D square. Sew into rows; press toward A/B units in Row 1 and Row 3, and press toward D square in Row 2. Sew rows together (press seams open) to create the Dot Dash block measuring 6 1/2" square.

Assembly

1. Layer (1) A triangle on (1) B square, right sides up and aligning corners; glue in place. Topstitch 1/8" from bias edge of A triangle with coordinating cotton thread. Make (4) A/B units.

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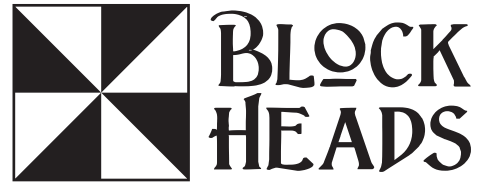
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Use (2) dark and (1) light fabrics. Fabrics are listed in order of use.

Traditional Patchwork

A - (4) squares, 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" (DARK #1)

B - (4) squares, 3" x 3" (LIGHT)

C - (4) rectangles, 1 1/2" x 3" (LIGHT)

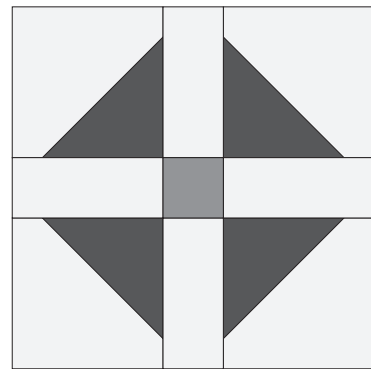
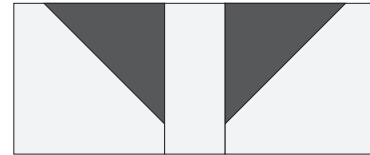
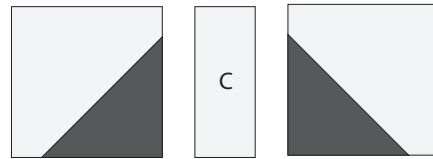
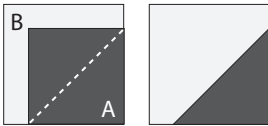
D - (1) square, 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" (DARK #2)

☒ = cut once diagonally from corner to corner

2. Lay out A/B units, C rectangles, and D square. Sew into rows; press toward A/B units in Row 1 and Row 3, and press toward D square in Row 2. Sew rows together (press seams open) to create the Dot Dash block measuring 6 1/2" square.

Assembly

1. On the wrong side of the A squares, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposing corner. Layer (1) A square on (1) B square, right sides together and align corners as shown. Stitch across the square on the drawn line. Trim the seam to 1/4". Press the seam toward the dark triangle. Make (4) A/B units.



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
